





Some things stay the same, some things change, and some mysteries remain unanswered.

The mystery: exactly when was this club founded??? In 1920, the date carved in stone over the clubhouse fireplace, in 1921 as told in the clubhouse history from 1981, or in 1922 when 10 Brutal Beasts were delivered to Peter's Point? Clearly there is more sleuthing to be done.

KOLLEGEWIDGWOK YACHT CLUB had its beginnings in East Blue Hill on the shore of Morgan's Bay in 1921 when Dr. Seth M. Milliken gave his son Seth and his daughter Alida each a Brutal Beast to sail. In 1922, ten more Brutal Beasts were delivered to the old steamboat wharf near what is now the Clements' house, and the first race was held on the Fourth of July.

In 1946, it was decided to settle on a piece of land between Blue Hill and East Blue Hill, and by the summer of 1948 the present Clubhouse was completed at the old abandoned Blue Hill quarry and quarry-pier on the East Blue Hill side of the inner bay, just above Eaton's Cove, inside Sculpin Point.

Dr. Milliken first coined the Club's name from the Indian words for "Blue Hill." When literally translated, "kollegewidgwok" means "the green mountain floating on sky blue water," as the Club burgee well illustrates.

I hope you are able to get out on the water this 4th of July weekend.
