Blue Hill Community Rowing

Two members of Blue Hill Community Rowing scored big in recent rowing events, one in Massachusetts, one in the Netherlands.

Nick Robinson of Sedgwick took first place in the Blackburn Challenge out of Gloucester, MA, a 20+ mile circumnavigation of Cape Ann. Nick won the men's division for boats with a single fixed-seat (as opposed to sliding seats). His time was three hours, twenty-eight minutes, 33 seconds, a rousing forty-seven minutes ahead of second place in the class.

Nick, an electrician at Brooklin Boat Yard, built his Herreshoff 17 last year. He often builds or repairs a small boat during the winter.

Nick said, "I didn't want to get burned out and make a mistake so I just kept up a steady state. Somehow I glided past a bunch of boats, maybe because mine is so light."

The other Blue Hill Rowing member to score was Carol Roberts, who attended the triennial six-day "Skiffie World" competition, held this year in Kortgene, the Netherlands. Rowers from seven countries attended the six-day competition for St. Ayles Skiffs. The St. Ayles, designed by Ian Oughtred, is a 22' double-ender that carries four rowers, each pulling one oar each, and a coxswain. The three US teams were Boston, Bowdoinham ME, and Lake Champlain, VT.

Three Blue Hill rowers went with the Lake Champlain team. Carol Roberts, Gardner Pickering, and Mary Hennessy. Carol was picked up on the dock by the Scottish team from North Berwick that needed a rower to fill out the crew for the "Over 280" event: the four rowers' ages had to add up to at least 280 years. The Scots-US rowers took third place with a time of 12:52, eight seconds behind first place. Carol was the only American to make the podium in this year's competition.

Carol said, "Rowing with the Scots was the highlight of the Regatta for me. It's not surprising that Scottish teams dominate this event. With over 100 coastal communities they row and race St Ayles skiffs multiple times a week year-round. But it's still surprising that they could pick up a rower they've never seen before and with 15 minutes to warm up come in 3rd.

Hamilton Marine Order Service located in the Ship's Store at KYC.

This is a service offered to all members.

How it works:

Place your order in the store before 3:00 pm and the item will arrive around 9:00 am the next business day, *as long as it is in stock*. All orders would need to be placed through the store. The store is located behind the clubhouse. Kelly is happy to do this via email (followed up by a call), phone, or in person. There is a Hamilton catalog in the store if needed.

The items do not cost the member more than what the parts are priced at in the catalog. There is no surcharge for the delivery from Hamilton, as they are giving the club a small discount for having one ordering location. It makes it easier for Hamilton as well as convenient for our Club.

The Hamilton order will be placed and once arrived, you can charge it to your account or pay by credit card, apple pay or google pay.
